



PSI Report No. 6.6 – Concluding Remarks

- Across the few demographical variables we have tested in these reports, namely, political alignment, social strata and civil activeness, it seems that co-variation is the general rule, but the gap is widest across respondents with different political alignments.
- What was not quite expected is the narrow gap between respondents of different class backgrounds, although there is a sign that the self-proclaimed "lower middle class" may be departing from the "middle class" and the "grassroots" in becoming relatively less happy.
- However, since this is just the beginning of our indepth PSI v2.0 analysis, a lot more observations are still to be made or further confirmed.

- Survey method: Random telephone survey conducted by real interviewers
- Target population: Cantonese-speaking Hong Kong residents aged 18 or above
- Sample size: 1,005 (including 504 landline and 501 mobile samples)
- Effective response rate: 54.5%
- Sampling error: Sampling error of ratings not more than +/-0.31 at 95% conf. level
- Weighting method: Rim-weighted according to figures provided by the Census and Statistics Department. The gender-age distribution of the Hong Kong population came from "Mid-year population for 2022", while the educational attainment (highest level attended) distribution and economic activity status distribution came from "Women and Men in Hong Kong - Key Statistics (2022 Edition)".

As for the seven non-core indicators, "degree of social welfare sufficiency" and "degree of civilization" got the highest ratings, followed by "degree of corruption-free practices", "degree of efficiency" and "degree of public order". "Degree of equality" and "degree of fairness" got relatively lower ratings. All non-core indicators except "degree of efficiency" have decreased significantly over the past six months.

Survey Result – Freedom Sub-indicators

- As for the freedom sub-indicators, the top 2 go to freedoms of "entering or leaving Hong Kong" and "religious belief", with 7.37 and 7.34 marks respectively, followed by freedoms of "academic research", "artistic and literary creation", "strike" and "speech", with 5.85, 5.59, 5.21 and 5.01 marks respectively. The next tier is formed by freedoms of "association", "publication" and "press", with 4.90, 4.74 and 4.70 marks respectively, while freedom of "procession and demonstration" scored much lower than the other sub-indicators, at 3.75 marks only.
- Compared with half a year ago, all freedom sub-indicators except freedoms of "entering or leaving Hong Kong", "religious belief" and "artistic and literary creation" have decreased significantly.
