

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




• Question: Q2 Which of the following measures do you think is more important? Please rank the following in descending order of importance.


• Question: Q3 How much influence do you think the opinions of the following groups have had on the content of the Budget?








• Question: Q8 If you had the right to vote on the reappointment or dismissal of Paul Chan as the Financial Secretary now, how would you vote?


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• Question: Q9 In your view, who are the main beneficiaries of the Budget?
